Dear Gardening Enthusiast:

The Purdue Cooperative Extension Service of Madison County will be offering the Master Gardener Intern Training beginning Thursday, January 13, 2011. The sessions will be held on Thursdays in the Fellowship Hall at Unity Church located at 2425 Mounds Road in Anderson from 9 a.m. to 12 noon.

The purpose of the Purdue Master Gardener program is to train volunteers to assist the Extension Office with horticultural education programs. The program involves classroom training and volunteer service helping with horticultural education in the community. The volunteer service can be fulfilled in a number of ways to be discussed during the Master Gardener series. Presenters for the series will include Extension Educators and local horticultural experts.

To obtain the Master Gardener title, participants are required to participate in all training sessions listed and to pass a final exam with a score of 70 percent or higher. After successfully completing the training, participants must also serve 35 hours of volunteer service as arranged in cooperation with the coordinating Extension Educator.
